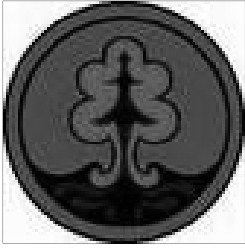

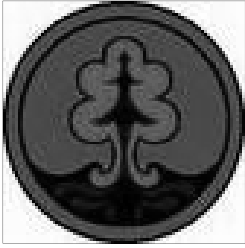

IMPORTANCE OF CLIMATE CHANGE FOR INDONESIA

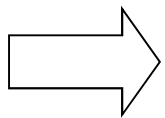
- Vulnerability: over 17,000 islands, 33 provinces, 453 districts, mostly small; agrarian and fishery culture relying on climate.
- Areas comparable with HFLD, LFC, SIDS, etc.
- Population is over 230 million and keep growing
- Potential for mitigation: forests (incl. peat), oceans.



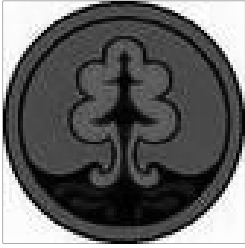

IMPORTANCE OF FORESTS

- About 65% of land
- Ample livelihood and employment opportunities
- Revenues
- Mega biodiversity
- Other environmental services (water, etc energy, etc).



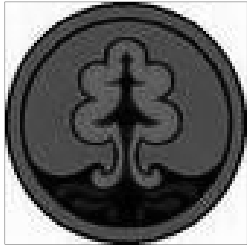
INDONESIA IS ACTIVE IN THE REDD PROCESS

INDONESIA ACTIVE IN REDD PROCESS

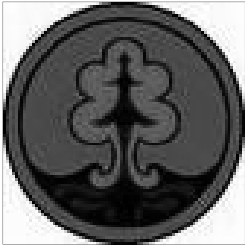
- Potential REDD fund is expected to complement efforts to achieve SFM
- Important is REDD's potential to improve forest governance, due to its performance based nature.

FIRST PARTNERSHIP: Indonesia Forest Climate Alliance

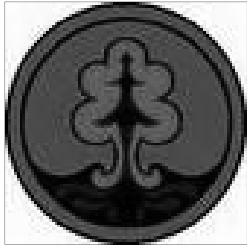
- IFCA was formed in July 2007 to analyze how REDD could operate.
- Coordinated by MOF, consisted of government, private sector, civil society, and scientific institutions, with support from international partners (WB, UK/DfID, Germany, Australia)
- Series of technical workshops, studies, and consolidation work
- Results presented during COP-13 in Bali, Dec. 07

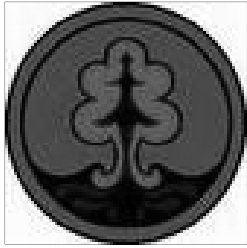
- Decision on Bali Action Plan: incl. long-term cooperation activities
- Decision on REDD: incl. inviting demonstration activities
- Ministry of Forestry issues Decisions on (i) Demonstration Activities, (ii) REDD Procedure, (iii) MOF-WG on Climate Change
- Further partnership for REDD readiness

INDONESIA - AUSTRALIA PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

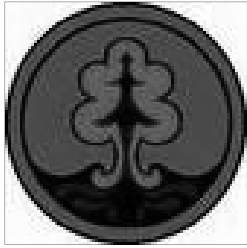
- Initial Technical Support for: (i) Forest Resource Information System (FRIS), (ii) REDD methodology development, (iii) institution support.
- Kalimantan Forest and Climate Partnership (KFCP): Large scale project based (on a 130,000 ha peat dome) with 4 elements: (i) reduction of deforestation on peat, (ii) emission measurement and monitoring, (iii) payment distribution system, (iv) capacity building.

INDONESIA - GERMANY PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

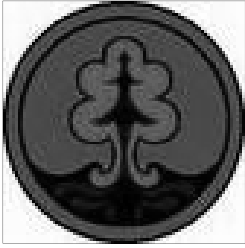
- Technical Cooperation: incl. Support to development of FMU for REDD implementation.
- Financial Cooperation: development of REDD demonstration activities in 3 districts in Kalimantan (so far 2):
 - Malinau: focusing on FMU development for REDD
 - Kapuas Hulu: focusing on community dev.

INDONESIA - JAPAN PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

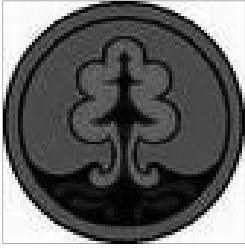
- Small scale demonstration activities in peat swamp areas of Jambi and South Sumatra (Berbak NP)

INDONESIA – REP. OF KOREA PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

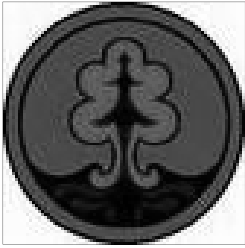
- CDM projects

INDONESIA – ITTO PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

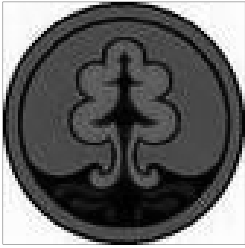
- Pipeline REDD demonstration activity project in Meru Betiri NP
- Financing by Japan private company through ITTO, implementation by MOF

INDONESIA – WORLD BANK PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

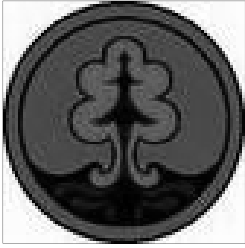
- Indonesia's participation in FCPF
- Indonesia's IFCA studies regarded a R-PIN stage, continues with R-Plan
- Draft R-Plan is submitted, to be followed with series of consultations prior to implementation
- Indonesia's participation in Forest Investment Programme (FIP)
- Third Design Meeting, 4-5 May 2009
- Indonesia welcomes FIP grants for public REDD demonstration activities, and concessional loan for private activities

INDONESIA – UN PARTNERSHIP ON REDD

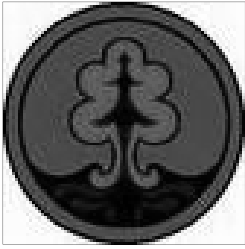
- Initiative by UNDP, FAO and UNEP with financial support from Govt. of Norway
- Launched in September 2008 by UN Sec.Gen.
- First Policy Board Meeting, Panama, 9-10 March 2009 endorsed Indonesia's National Joint Programme
- Include national, provincial, and district support on REDD readiness.
- Second Policy Board Meeting, Montreux, Switzerland, 14-15 June 2009

- EXPECTED TO HELP SHAPE A WORKABLE REDD MECHANISM
- Constitutes elements of Indonesia's overall REDD strategy
- The REDD strategy is part of endeavours to achieve SFM
